

Notes:

- 1. This Inventory includes the main buildings, as well as barns, stables, wind mills and large sheds, garages; but excludes minor structures like latrines, pump houses, sheds, wells, dams, fences, small sheds (generally under 10 x 10 feet square), etc.
- 2. The primary source for this inventory is the Sessional Papers of the federal; Department of Public Works, as well as other federal departments (Militia, NWMP, Indian Affairs, Justice, Interior), and the annual reports of the North-West Territories.
- 3. "Plans: Department" = federal Department of Public Works
- 4. Residential Schools are excluded from this study as they were operated by various religious denominations, not by the federal or Territorial governments.














