THEY ALWAYS GET 'EM

It was a nice, up-to-date, good producing, energetic little still, and Engineer Decock, of Deleau, had considerable pride in it, because it produced results almost beyond his expectations. It was located, reported, and Thursday morning last, all was in readiness to take off a brew—doors were open to allow the hard working still to get all the fresh ozone possible. Everything was going fine and the operator had already begun to count up his profits from the liquor now in its final stages of distilling.
